She still got tested a few more times, but eventually we could say she for sure beat Cryptococcus!! ☐

Eventually her allergies got more manageable. She never came off her allergy shots or antihistamines, but she actually wasn't scratching and biting herself like she used to. They did help her a lot.

What did get worse was her heart murmur. I was told by her doctors what to watch out for because she may get congestive heart failure. Ultimately that is the battle she couldn't beat. ☐
